

Quick Note 26/04/2018

Spain • The labour market performed well in Q1 2018, albeit losing some buoyancy

Data

- In seasonally adjusted terms, the QoQ change to employment in Q1 2018 stood at 0.46% (0.47% in Q4 2017).
- The YoY change to employment stood at 2.4% in Q1 2018 (2.6% in Q4 2017).
- In the last four quarters:
 - Employment: rose by 435,900 to 18,874,200.
 - Active population: declined by 23,000 to 22,670,300.
 - **Unemployment**: declined by 458,900 to 3,796,100.
- The unemployment rate stood at 16.7% in Q1 2018 (-2.0 pp in the last year).

Assessment

- The labour market performed well, but again lost some momentum in the first quarter of the year. This was evidenced by the fact that in seasonally adjusted terms job creation was positive (0.5% QoQ) at a similar rate to Q4 2017, but somewhat below the average for the first three quarters of 2017 (0.7%).
- The **growth in employment** (435,900 accumulated in all four quarters) was somewhat **less robust than anticipated** by CaixaBank Research (500,100), and far smaller than the uptick in social security affiliates (592,100) in the same period.
- The private sector again spearheaded job creation, adding 319,000 workers in the last year, but showing a slowing trend. On the other hand, the increase in public employment stood out at 132,000 in the last four quarters, far faster growth than observed in recent years.
- By economic sectors, **there was standout uptick in the construction industry** (70,500 jobs over the four quarters), which is a larger increase than observed in 2017 (54,500).
- The number of unemployed was down very significantly in the last four quarters (-458,900), while the unemployment rate stood at 16.7% (18.8% in Q1 2017), meaning the average unemployment rate declined 2.0 pp in the last year. During the last quarter, however, the unemployment rate rose slightly due to the number of unemployed rising 29,400, as a result of the first quarter's negative seasonality.
- One positive aspect, albeit it is frequently seen in the first quarter, was the **slight decline in the temporary employment rate, which stood at 26.1%** (26.7% in Q4 2017), although the current level stands above those of Q1 2017 (25.8%) and remains high compared to European standards.
- Looking ahead to the coming quarters, the labour market is expected to perform well, albeit losing some
 momentum, which would be consistent with the anticipated easing in the pace of Spanish economic
 growth.
- In the light of these figures, the risks surrounding the **employment growth forecast of 2.4% for 2018** look to be slightly on the downside.





Employment (seasonally adjusted)




Employment by employer
