# **Spain** · Job creation gains momentum in 4Q 2018

### Data

- In seasonally adjusted terms, the QoQ change to employment during 4Q 2018 stood at 0.9% (0.6% in 3Q 2018).
- The YoY change to employment amounted to 3.0% in 4Q 2018 (2.5% in 3Q 2018).
- In the last four quarters:
  - Employment: rose by 566,000 to 19,565,000.
  - The active population: expanded by 15,000 to 22,869,000.
  - **Unemployment**: was down by 462,000 to 3,304,000.
- The unemployment rate stood at 14.4% in 4Q 2018 (-2.1 pp in the last year).

### **Assessment**

- The labour market posted a very good performance in the fourth quarter of the year, as evidenced by job creation rallying to 3.0% YoY, after slowing slightly for several quarters. This is the best pace since 1Q 2016 and comes in what is traditionally a weak quarter.
- Employment growth (566,000 individuals accumulated over four quarters) was **far stronger than forecast** by CaixaBank Research (485,000), with a similar uptick in social security affiliates (564,000) during the same period.
- The private sector again spearheaded job creation, adding 430,000 workers last year, meaning a 2.7% YoY increase. Likewise, there was a standout change in the creation of public sector jobs, with an increase of 136,000 accumulated in all four quarters, representing expansion of 4.4% YoY, stronger than observed in 4Q 2017 (+3.0%).
- By sectors of the economy, there was particularly vigorous employment growth during 4Q in the services sector (YoY change of 428,000), far higher than seen in 4Q 2017 (290,000), and likewise in the construction sector (136,000 more jobs, compared to 64,000 in 4Q 2017). This faster expansion offset lower occupation in the industrial sector (-3,000 employed, compared to +132,000 in 4Q 2017), marking several consecutive weak quarters.
- The number of unemployed declined very robustly in the last four quarters (-462,000 individuals), while the **unemployment rate stood at 14.4%** (16.5% in 4Q 2017), the lowest figure since 4Q 2008. Last year the unemployment rate declined 2.1 pp, accumulating more than five years of declines following the peak level reached in 2013.
- The temporary employment rate stood at 26.9% (26.7% in 2Q 2018), similar to the previous year's figure and much higher than European standards.
- Looking ahead to the coming quarters, the labour market is expected to perform well, albeit losing some momentum, which would be consistent with the anticipated easing in the pace of Spanish economic growth.
- In the light of these figures, employment growth in 2019 may stand slightly higher than the forecast expansion of 1.9%.







# **Employment (seasonally adjusted)**




